How office and storefront locks differ

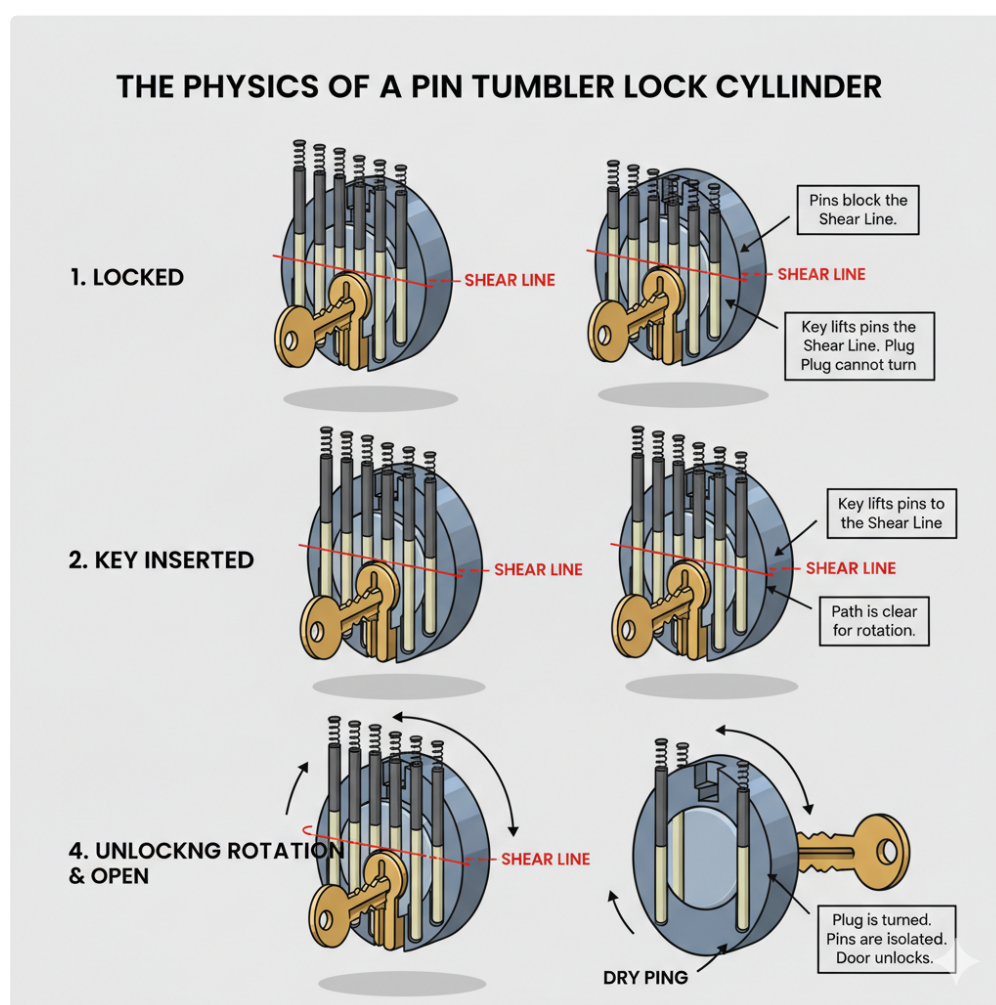
