Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Really slight indications of wear, generally visible only on close examination.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious scratches and endure prominent edges and paint surfaces.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear, heavy scratching, and dulled colors.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Extreme wear, rusted metal, heavily cracked paint, and distressed looks.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "float-capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making their least expensive readily available wear condition incredibly valuable.
