4. Prize/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple players deposit skins into a cumulative pot. Each skin contributes tickets based on its dollar worth. A random draw picks a winner, where a greater total contribution yields a greater analytical opportunity of winning the whole pot.
- **Appeal:** The supreme "high-roller" game mode, where single fortunate winners can walk away with thousands of dollars in rare digital products.
